School Hours

Children are expected to be in class, prepared for the day by 8.55am. Please ensure you have your child at school in plenty of time.

For safety and supervision reasons no child should be on the school grounds before 8:00 and we discourage children being dropped off before 8.15am. Please Note: Classrooms may be locked until 8:30 as teachers are involved in meetings and daily preparations.

School finishes at 3pm and for safety and supervision reasons children are expected to leave the school grounds promptly.

Donations

Parking

Kea Crossing

Ensure your children cross the road either at the Kea Crossing on Allum Street or at the lights on the corner of Allum St and Kohimarama Road.

The Kea Crossing must be kept clear of cars and it is illegal to turn your car near the crossing when it is in operation.

Picking up Children during the School Day

If you need to pick up your child for an appointment during the school day please be aware that you cannot do this between 10.30 -10.50 and 12.30 – 1.30. Please arrange to collect them either before or after these times.

National Standards

The Government has announced that National Standards will be removed from 2018. Instead schools will focus on the progress and achievement of all children across the wider New Zealand Curriculum.

This change will better acknowledge the different ways and pace at which children learn, and support teachers to provide more learning opportunities based on what children already know and can do.

Schools will still be required to report to parents, at least twice a year, on their child's progress and achievement, especially in the foundational learning areas of maths, reading, and writing. But schools will no longer be required to use National Standards for this reporting.

Education Review Office (ERO) reports on a local community's schools will remain the best guide to their performance, the quality of their teaching and school leadership, and the steps they are taking to progress children's learning. These reports provide a much more comprehensive picture of the quality of your local schools than did National Standards data.

Information on the how children, or groups of children, are progressing and achieving nationally, will come from the National Monitoring of Student Achievement (NMSA). These studies test several thousand children each year on different areas of the curriculum. International studies will also help provide parents, whānau as well as schools and the Ministry, with valuable information on student progress and achievement. The new approach will be developed with sector experts, parents,



whānau, iwi and students during 2018. We expect this new system of progress assessment and reporting to come online gradually between 2018 and 2019.
