AIMS Games 2026

What an incredible week it was at the Zespri AIMS Games! After months of preparation, training, fundraising, organising and plenty of excitement, our 32 athletes finally travelled down to Tauranga on Saturday, ready to take on one of the biggest Intermediate Schools sporting events in the country.

Saturday was an exciting start to the week as we settled into our accommodation, unpacked, set up our houses and got everyone organised for the days ahead. We then headed down to the beach for a pizza dinner, giving everyone the chance to enjoy some downtime together before the competition got underway.



Sunday saw our girls take to the netball courts for their first taste of AIMS Games competition. They were thrown straight into some tough opposition but showed plenty of determination and resilience. Despite a challenging start, they didn't let it affect their spirits and we soon found ourselves heading off to the AIMS Games Opening Ceremony.

The Opening Ceremony was one of the highlights of the week. To see our students surrounded by thousands of talented young athletes from schools across New Zealand was an incredible experience. The atmosphere was electric, and it was a special opportunity for our students to appreciate just how big this event really is. We heard some fantastic stories and messages from sporting personalities, including Kurt Eklund from the Blues, Jaymie Kolose from the Blues Women, Amelia Walmsley from the Silver Ferns and Francis de Vries from Auckland FC & All Whites. The students also loved watching Frankie Venter perform. It was a brilliant way to officially kick off the week.

Monday to Friday was then all about competition. Our netball, football and basketball teams were thrown into some seriously high-level sporting contests, competing against schools from all over the country. There were some fantastic wins, some tough losses and plenty of moments that tested our students, but what remained consistent throughout the entire week was the team spirit.

It was awesome to see our students getting stuck into every game, backing each other, celebrating the wins and picking each other up after the tougher moments. They continued to push themselves, learn from their experiences and compete with pride. We were particularly proud of the way they conducted themselves away from the playing fields too, showing respect, independence and responsibility throughout the week.

AIMS Games is about so much more than the results. It gave our students the opportunity to experience high-level competition, meet athletes from around the country, challenge themselves outside of their comfort zones and develop skills that extend well beyond the sporting arena. They learnt about teamwork, resilience, independence, sportsmanship and what it means to commit to a goal and work hard to achieve it.



We are incredibly proud of all 32 of our athletes. Every single student worked so hard to prepare for this event and then gave everything they had once they arrived in Tauranga. They represented St Thomas's with pride, enthusiasm and plenty of heart, and we couldn't have asked for a better group to take away.

A huge thank you also goes to all of our families, parent helpers, supporters, coaches, managers and staff who helped make this experience possible. There is an enormous amount of work that goes on behind the scenes to get 32 students to an event of this scale, and we are incredibly grateful for everyone's support.

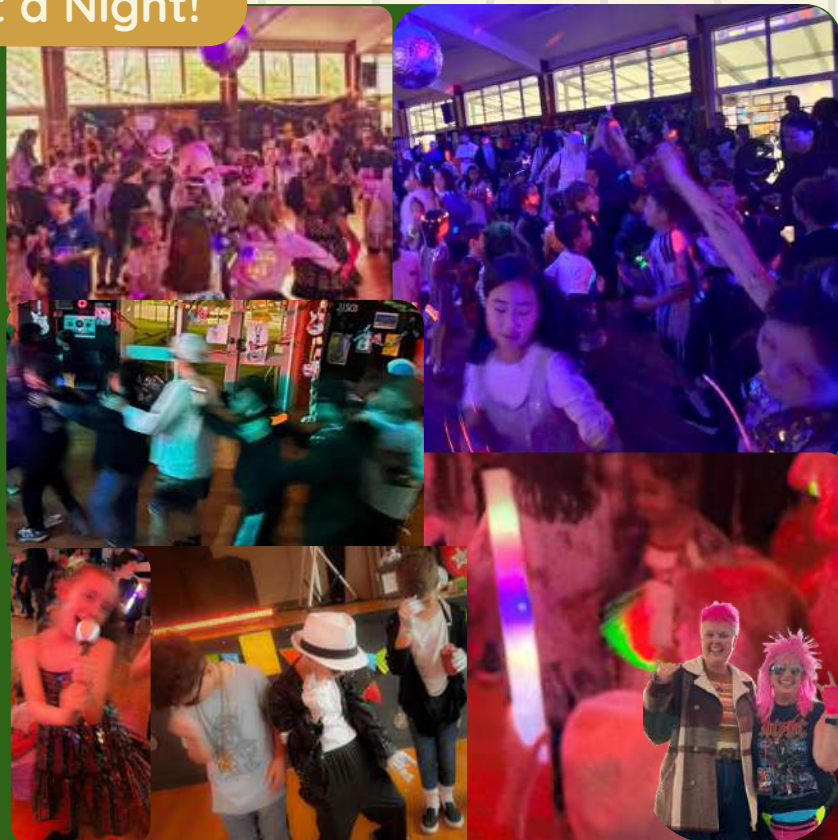
