A Report by J4 students about St Thomas's "Birdsong Day"

We had a fabulous Birdsong Day on 11th September. As a school we thought it would be wonderful if we had lots of native birds and trees in our field down the bank. If you're wondering how St Thomas's School did it, read on! At the beginning of this term some keen NZ native bird loving students wrote to Nicky Elmore who is responsible for promoting Enviroschools at Auckland Council. These students requested help to fund the purchase of some native trees via the Auckland Council. Our request was granted, and Auckland Council gifted us 90 native trees via the Eastern Bays Birdsong Project and NETR funding

In week 5 St Thomas's kids wrote to their parents to request help with the digging and planting. Anyone from school who wanted to come to dig holes and plant the trees. Our families decided to help dig the 90 holes for 90 native trees. We dug the holes on Saturday 7th September. Our families made a wood path from the leftover wood from an old pine tree which was hazardous, so it was chopped down. We also helped pick up pinecones. We had loads of fun seeing our friends and my teacher on a Saturday at school. It was such a good idea to make a bird sanctuary down the bank at school.

Planting day was four days later on Wednesday 11th September. We blessed the land with a karakia before planting. On plant day we got in our house groups and joined other year groups and we rotated around the classes. We made origami birds, bird hats, bird headbands, bird badges, bird masks, collage birds, pottery birds and paper plate birds.

St Thomas's plan is to build bird houses, bird feeders and set traps for predators so we can achieve our goal to attract NZ native birds. We are planning to make our native bush a play area as we improve our environment, add play structures and outdoor learning areas. We are currently monitoring some Eastern Songbird rat traps to keep our environment predator free.

During the "Birdsong" process we learnt that birds are dying due to predators killing them and their eggs but hundreds of people like us are helping to bring back the birdsong.

Student Led Conferences


