### **School Roll**

The introduction of the Unitary Plan has caused significant changes across Auckland in the types and density of housing which can be built in the city. These changes have impacted schools in a variety of ways with some schools facing significant population increases in their In-Zone catchment area as single houses are replaced with multiple dwellings. Other schools having falling rolls as houses are replaced with apartment blocks for retirement age people.

In 2018 St Thomas's School had a roll of 800 students with the roll forecast to grow to approximately 900 in the coming years. This roll growth was expected to come from new green field developments, especially the site next to Selwyn College which had a proposed 150 house development and another at Donnelly St which had 80 house development. However, St Thomas's School will not have students coming from either of these developments as Ryman Healthcare are building on the Selwyn land and the Ministry of Education have decided that as the Donnelly St development has access towards Stonefields, students from these houses will be zoned for Stonefields School.

Staffing allocation from the Ministry of Education and funding to operate a school is based on the school roll, the larger the student numbers the more staffing and funding a school receives. We believe that the 'sweet spot' for St Thomas's School roll would be around 750. This number provides the school with adequate staffing which allows us to have small classes and provide extras such as reading support teachers, English language support teachers and specialists such as sports coordinators. It also provides funding to allow us to have adequate teacher aide numbers, library and ancillary staffing. Additionally, it allows our students to have lots of green space and outdoor learning spaces without the feeling of being crowded.

In 2020, we accepted a small group of Out of Zone students and will continue to do this going forward with the aim of maintaining our roll over 700. If you have friends who wish to have their child attend St Thomas's School, then please have them contact the front office staff and we will include their names on our ballot system.

## **Important Note Regarding Absences**

Just a reminder to parents that reporting absences **before 9.00am** is very important for the safety and wellbeing of students.

If your child is going to be late, you still need to advise the school and give a reason i.e Doctor or Dentist etc.

## **Counselling at St Thomas's School**

In 2019, St Thomas's School introduced a free counselling service for students as part of our wellbeing programme. This service was very well received by our student and parent community and has been in big demand since it started.

This year our school will continue to provide an in-school counselling service and indeed we are one of the few primary schools to do so. However due to reduced income related to Covid-19, we will be asking for a fee from parents of students who avail of this service to offset some of the actual cost of this service.

### The cost of the programme is \$25 per session.

The initial consultation with parents who feel their child would benefit from this service is free and the expectation is that once students start counselling, they would commit to 3 sessions at a total cost of \$75. The idea of 3 sessions is that it often takes time for students to feel comfortable to discuss what is really going on for them. The counsellor, parents and students could then decide whether to stop the sessions, continue the sessions or move on to external professionals for more specialised help.

### **Counselling Referrals**

Charlotte Letcher is our school Guidance Counsellor for 2021.

Charlotte has a Bachelor of Education, has taught as a primary school teacher for 13 years and has two years of counselling training experience from Laidlaw College and the University of Auckland where she is completing her final two papers in a Postgraduate Diploma in Counselling Theory before starting her Masters in Counselling.

Referrals for our counsellor can be made by parents or teachers and are made to Emma Johnson our SENCo. Emma then contacts the parents to discuss referrals and then sends out a referral and a permission form to the student's parent or caregivers.

Once permission has been received our counsellor Charlotte will contact the parents and caregivers to arrange an initial meeting with them to discuss their child's needs. After this Charlotte will meet with the student on a weekly basis. At the end of the first 3 sessions Charlotte will again make contact with the whanau to discuss the next steps.
