Relaunch of Real-Time Parent Reporting

In 2017 St Thomas's School was one of the first primary schools to launch a real-time reporting portal for our parent community with teachers sharing information on student progress. Since then, we have had many other primary schools adopt a similar approach to reporting, and indeed have supported a number of them to do so. The Ministry of Education now has an expectation that, going forward, all schools will move in this direction.

When we first launched in 2017 it was a steep learning curve for our parents and teaching staff and we held information sessions to help parents access the portal and understand how it worked. Since the initial launch we have tweaked the portal several times as needs arose and/or technology changed. With the demise of National Standards in 2018 and with more of a focus on learning progressions we have been working behind the scenes on development of a new portal which we are very excited to launch today.

A large amount of time and effort has gone into the development of this and I would like to acknowledge all our teaching staff for their input, our Community of Learning leaders for their work on the learning progressions and Deputy Principal, Claire Fromow, for her tireless work on the development of the portal, especially the technical aspects. We are also incredibly grateful to those parents who allowed us to use their childrens' accounts to test our new system and to those who were part of the focus group trialling the Hero app.

Similar to our first launch in 2017, it will take us all some time to get use to the new reporting format and we will hold information sessions to support parents. This is an exciting next stage for St Thomas's School as we make our teaching and learning as transparent and as meaningful as possible for our whole community.

Hero Parent Reporting System

We are delighted to launch our new parent reporting system through our existing communications app, Hero. Your child's progress to date in 2021 is available from now, and further progress will be available, live and in real-time, ongoing.

Hero parent reporting is an online environment that reflects our unique context and local curriculum including our St Thomas's School Learning Progressions. It enables teachers and families to view content anytime, anywhere on any device. The software is secure, easy to use and brings together all school-related information in one place.

We are excited about the features that our new parent reporting system has to offer you:

- read posts and personalised comments relating to your child's learning
- view information on your child's progress and learning goals
- read notices sent to the class or groups your child is part of
- respond to school notices such as surveys and trip permission requests
- view school term dates
- view a school calendar of events
- notify the school if your child is absent or late
- navigate to other school-related web pages



Going forward, goal setting, St Thomas's School Learning Progressions achievement, effort ratings, St Thomas's School Learner Attribute assessments and personalised student comments will form an online report designed to build year on year so that over time you will have access to a range of information relevant to your child's learning all in one place.


We encourage you to log into your existing Hero app and have a look at the reporting information that is now available for your child/children.



Keeping Ourselves Safe Parent Information Evening

To start Term 3 off every teacher will be delivering the Keeping Ourselves Safe Programme to their students. This programme will be delivered in weeks 1-3.

On Thursday 1st July at 6.30pm in the staff room our Community Constable, Gordon Campbell, will be running a Parent Information evening where he will talk through the key themes of the programme and answer any questions parents may have.

Below is an outline of what is covered and what your involvement is as a parent.

What will children and young people learn?

They will learn:

- To work out when their safety is at risk.
- How to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people.
- Who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused.
- To go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse.
- That it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules.

They will know:

- That abuse is never okay.
- That abuse is never their fault.


What part do parents, caregivers and whānau play?

Parents and whānau are strongly encouraged to support Keeping Ourselves Safe.

- You can attend a meeting at school to tell you more about Keeping Ourselves Safe.
- You can find out about abuse and what to do if you think a child, you know is being abused.
- You can talk to your child about what they have learnt in Keeping Ourselves Safe.
- You can set safety guidelines with your family.
- You can help young children with the Keeping Ourselves Safe activities they bring home.
- You can give the same safety messages as the school is giving.
