

## School Enrolment 2022

As noted in our February newsletter, St Thomas's School had a roll of over 800 students in 2018 with the roll forecast to grow to approximately 900 in the coming years. This roll growth was expected to come from new green field development; especially the site next to Selwyn College which had a proposed 150 house development, a development on St Johns Road and another at Donnelly St which had an 80 house development. However, Ryman Healthcare are building on the Selwyn land, Summerset are building a retirement home on St John's Road and the Ministry of Education have decided that as the Donnelly St development has access towards Stonefields School, students from those houses will be dual zoned for Stonefields School and St Thomas's School.

Staffing allocation and funding from the Ministry of Education to operate a school is based on the school roll. We believe that the 'sweet spot' for St Thomas's School roll would be around 750. This number provides the school with adequate staffing and funding which allows us to have small classes and provide extras such as reading support teachers, English language support teachers and specialists such as sports coordinators, occupational therapists, and a school counsellor. It also provides funding to allow us to have adequate teacher aide numbers, library, and ancillary staffing.

In 2020, we accepted a small group of Out of Zone students and will continue to do so going forward with the aim of maintaining our roll over 700. Over the coming term we will advertise for out of zone enrolments in our local paper and install signage around the school to notify the community of our enrolment intentions. If you have out of zone friends who wish to have their child attend St Thomas's School, then please have them contact the front office staff and we will include their names on our ballot system.

If you have friends or neighbours who are in zone with young children due to start school soon, please have them contact the front office for an in-zone enrolment pack asap. This will be helpful for planning our staffing.



### Safety On the Way To and From School.

Quite a few of our students are riding bicycles or scooters to school. It is a legal requirement for cyclists to wear a helmet while riding a bicycle and we enforce this as a school to ensure our students stay safe. Students riding scooters are not legally required to wear helmets but are vulnerable to skull fractures, concussion and traumatic brain injury if they fall off and hit their head. We ask parents to discuss this with their child and ensure they wear helmets while scootering to and from school to prevent injury.

### **Attendance at School**

Attached is a graph of attendance which shows the level of attendance of St Thomas's students for Term 1 and compares us to other similar schools. It is reassuring to see that our attendance levels are well above other similar type schools in Auckland. Attendance research shows that high student attendance in a school indicates a parent community who are committed to education, that students feel safe with their peers, do not feel bullied, have strong relationships with their teachers and feel valued. As would be expected, high attendance levels are also closely linked with achievement and students who attend regularly in primary school stay in the education system longer. So well done to our parents, students and teachers for creating a welcoming safe learning environment where students are happy to attend.

## **Reporting Student Absences**

We would like to remind all parents/caregivers that reporting absences is important for the safety and wellbeing of students.

We aim to deal with all unexplained absences as quickly as possible each morning.

To minimise the number of unexplained absences, it is helpful if parents/caregivers take a few moments to advise the school of an absence in one the following ways:

- Through our Hero App (preferred)
- By telephone and leave a message 09 5283938 select option 1
- Text message to 0277580542

#### It is not necessary to email the class teacher.

Absences must be reported each day, unless the office has been advised in advance of the duration of an absence. You must state the reason for absence i.e. sick, doctor's appointment, holiday or bereavement.

Any students arriving late to school must report to the office and sign in, so that their safe arrival can be recorded. Please note all late arrivals are recorded, should your child be late on a regular basis follow up action will be taken.

Please note that while we may try several alternative phone numbers to contact a parent/caregiver, if calls are not answered, where possible we will leave a voice message. If your phone numbers change, whether it is a work, home or mobile number, can you please advise the office.

Should you wish to collect your child early from school, please come to the office and sign your child out. Please note: we do not let your children go home with someone that is not on the child's record card. Students cannot be signed out during morning break or lunchtime so if they have an appointment, please pick them up before morning break (10.30am - 10.50am) and lunch (12.30pm - 1.30pm).

If you child is unwell during the school day, they should go to sick bay. They must **not** phone or text their parents/caregivers themselves.
