


## **Principal's Message**

### **Allum Street Traffic**

A big thanks to parents who are following the road rules and our repeated requests for caution on the roads during drop-off and pick-up times. We have noticed that mornings are a lot better with very few parents now making dangerous driving decisions and putting our students at risk.

The afternoon pick-up window is still a cause of concern for us however, with the main dangers being:

 Parents double-parking alongside the big tree to allow children out of, or into, their car – this blocks the flow of traffic down Allum Street and creates blind spots for other vehicles.

 Parents double-parking alongside other cars parked within the parking bays to allow children into their car – this blocks the flow

of traffic down Allum Street and creates blind spots for other vehicles. It also puts students at risk of being hit by other moving vehicles.

When cars are parked inside the parking bay, yellow lines mean you cannot pull up alongside (double park) to drop off or pick up children. Please continue down the street to find a safe alternative.



Yellow lines and 'NO PARKING' signs mean you cannot park here. This includes stopping to allow children into or out of your car.

Parents parking on the yellow lines outside the staff carpark to wait for their children and/or allow children out of, or into, their car – this causes chaos in a number of ways and we will be having random visits from parking wardens to ticket this activity going forward. Yellow lines = no parking, it is very simple.

 Parents performing u-turns outside the school after picking up or picking up their childred blocks the road, disrupts traffic flow in both directions, creates blind spots, puts our students and other motorists vehicles in danger and is generally inconsiderate to others and our repeated requests to help keep traffic flowing as freely as possible. Instead of u-turning, please proceed further down Allum Street and exit via another road or turn around where it is safe to do so.



Parents running, or sending/calling, their children across the road instead of using the crossings. There is a Kea Crossing less than 50m down Allum Street and Traffic Light Crossing less than 50m up Allum Street from this point. Please use the crossings.

The safety of our students is important to us. DO NOT risk lives for the sake of a 20 second walk.

## Bike Month - March 2023

In coordination with Travelwise we are supporting Bike Month in March.

We will be holding a **Wheels Wednesday** on 29 March and students will be encouraged to ride to school. The theme will be 'Be Bright Be Seen'. Students could wear a bright jacket, high vis vest or decorate their bikes. The day will also include a slow race for students to demonstrate their bike skills. Students must wear helmets to be able to compete.



# **Travelwise Day**

On Friday 10th of March, the Enviro Leaders took part in the Travelwise Student Leader conference, hosted by Auckland Council. The event focused on improving road safety and decreasing the number of vehicles at school gates, specifically at peak times, as well as encouraging students to be more active through walking, biking and scootering. The Travelwise team covered topics all connected to road safety in schools; from

parking and speed to transportation and crossings.

After the 'Student Leader' workshop to start the day, students participated in a number of workshops such as 'Speed', where we were able to check the speed of cars that passed by with the radar guns offered by Travelwise - these can be used in school areas to verify that drivers of the region are under the speed limit (40k/m), especially during peak times, when children are around. Safe parking posters were made too, along with a workshop on how illegal parking (parking on yellow broken lines, driveways, pathways, noparking zones, parking in bus stops, double parking, etc...)



impacts our students safety. We also took a deep dive into transportation and ways we can encourage pupils to walk, bike, scooter or use public transport with initiatives like Park & Walk and Bike Day as an alternative to using cars to reduce congestion in our school area, air pollution, increase the percentage of exercise done in the student's day, and there's less use of fuel for the child's whānau! The conference concluded with a workshop focusing on the Walking to School Bus, and ways we can initiate it at St Thomas, featuring Happy Feet, the mascot!

To us enviro leaders, road safety means a healthier school and environment, as well as healthy students within - this event allowed our team to learn about road safety in schools and innovative ways we can allow our students to grow in a safe environment. We hope to take on the knowledge and the resources from Travelwise to make sure our school is travel-wise for this year and for the future ahead.

Park & Walk - A route that gives parents and caregivers spots to drop-off their kids to avoid congestion near school gates.

Bike Day - A way to promote a sustainable way of travelling to school by getting students to come to school with bright, colourful bikes and sometimes getting prizes for it.
