

Principal's Message



Enviro Leaders Trip to VISY Recycling Centre

Last Friday, the Enviro Leaders visited VISY, a recycling centre in Onehunga. There, we learnt all sorts of things about rubbish and how the recycling system works. It was an enjoyable and interesting experience for us and Ms Snell. We went there to learn how they recycle plastics and other things, and bring that new knowledge back to educate everyone at St Thomas's. And the bonus was that we had the opportunity to visit a section where the rubbish trucks dump the rubbish into a pile!

We learnt all about what can and can't go into the recycling bin, with some other mind-blowing tips on how to reduce our rubbish, through talks and videos. Below are some interesting facts that we learnt at VISY:

- Those little yoghurt pottles can't be recycled due to the plastic they're made of.
- If you put a scrunched-up plastic bottle in the recycling bin the machines will sort it as paper.
- Six-pack rings can't be recycled.
- Glass is sorted into three categories: clear, brown, and green.

From this visit we hope to share our knowledge with all of St Thomas's, and play a part in reducing our waste. Especially to me, the Three R's (reducing, reusing, and recycling) mean a lot more than three words. It's all about doing small things regularly and eventually making a conspicuous difference in our world, which all of us could do.

One week later...

We did a waste audit and looked at all the waste STS has made in a day. First we went to all of the school classes after school to collect all their rubbish. Then the next day we met with one of the Auckland City Council people, her name was Nicky. She explained to us about the different types of rubbish and where they go. Next, we took the rubbish out of one of the black bags and dumped it onto the blue mat. We put on gloves and sorted out the rubbish into different sections such as soft plastic, paper and cardboard, plastic, compost, etc. When there was no more rubbish on the mat, we opened another bag and poured that rubbish onto the mat and sorted it. We repeated this process until there were no more bags. After we had separated all of the rubbish into different sections, we weighed them to find out how much of which type of rubbish we had in the school. We found out that the most amount of rubbish in this school was paper. Doing this was both interesting and a bit messy too.




Road Works on Allum Street

Fulton Hogan, on behalf of Auckland Council Healthy Waters, have advised us that they are planning to undertake some stormwater works – specifically being the installation of a catchpit backing plate as well as the replacement of the catchpit grate and frame outside our school on Allum Street over the school holidays.

The planned date for these works is **Thursday 13th April 2023** between the hours of 8am – 5pm, however this is weather dependant and contingency days have been allowed.

Due to the location of the works, traffic management will be in place to direct vehicular traffic and pedestrians away from the area. We are hopeful that being school holidays it will be only minimally impactful on our community.



Orienteering



On Friday 31 March, 54 students, across Year 5-8, participated in the Eastern Zone Orienteering Competition at Waiatarua. They were all a credit to St Thomas's School, both behaviour-wise and also with their orienteering skills. There were some great results from students who polished off their course in excellent times but even more impressive to see were those who persevered and found their away around the course, determined to get to the finish. Most of these completed all their controls in the correct order or missed just one or two controls.



It was a staggeringly good effort from them all – every student there was a winner! For those for whom this event was their first experience of orienteering, they did even better! It was great to see the St Thomas's Year 5/6 students get around the course so well. They were hard courses for them so they did wonderfully to find their way around - it will be a great lead up for them in the Year7/8 years.
