In New Zealand, the winter solstice takes place on Thursday 22 June 2023 at 2.57am

### **ONGOING CROSS-COUNTRY TRAINING**

At the start of Term 3, students in Years 3-8 will be participating in 3x cross-country training runs per week (Monday, Wednesday, Friday). Our teachers and office staff have been receiving a few leave applications from families wishing to travel abroad with their children. A few families have also asked teachers to provide school work for their children while they are away.


Please note that we **do not** provide home learning work for students who are away from school for any reason other than extreme medical circumstances (e.g. long term illness).

Working in teams of four, students were given a different challenge each week which they had to construct according to a set of criteria. 
