

Principal's Message

Teacher Staffing Shortage-its only going to get worse!

A key part of the recent Primary Teachers' Collective Agreement settlement included significant increases in classroom release time (CRT) for primary teachers. This release time is a welcome support for teachers to assist with term planning, student assessment, following up individual student issues, meeting with Ministry specialists and for professional development.

CRT for all primary teachers will increase from two days, to three days per term from the start of next year. By Term 3 next year it will increase by a further day to four days. At the start of 2025 one more day is included totalling five days per term to start in 2025. Teachers with additional responsibility and/or leadership roles will also receive an additional two days release time per term starting in 2025.

This is the first movement teachers have seen in CRT since 2005 and it will hopefully reduce the current workload and entice more people to view the teaching profession as a worthwhile and sustainable career, because we need people to join our profession.

The increase in CRT will mean that 1500 extra teachers will be required between Term 1 of next year and the start of 2025 to cover this extra release time. Unfortunately, New Zealand has few trainee teachers. Currently there are only 65 students training to be teachers in Auckland University. 2024 and 2025 are going to be incredibly challenging for all schools across the country to maintain class coverage. Already some schools have their entire senior management team covering classes or splitting classes across the school in order not to send students home, with both options unsustainable.

Hopefully the new CRT allocation will reduce teacher stress and workloads, strengthen the delivery of quality curriculum to our students and entice more people to view the teaching profession

as sustainable and worthwhile. In the meantime, it's going to be a bumpy ride for all schools to provide enough quality staff to cover classes.

School Absences

We would like to remind parents that reporting absences is important for the safety and wellbeing of students. We aim to deal with all unexplained absences as quickly as possible each morning. However, this is proving difficult now as some parents are not advising the school by 9.00am of their child's absence. To minimise the number of unexplained absences, please take a few moments to advise the school of an absence, through our HERO app (preferable), or by phoning the school on 528-3938 (1) and leaving a message. Please advise why your child is away. If they are going to be late, please advise why they will be late, so we can code the absence correctly. It takes parents less than a minute to advise the office, it takes the office a lot of extra time to follow up on 20 or 30 students.

Any students arriving late at school must report to the office and sign in, so that their safe arrival can be recorded. (Please note all late arrivals are recorded, should your child be late on a regular basis follow up action will be taken. Our gate is locked at 8.55am and we do have a lot of students arriving 5 minutes late. Please note, the school roll is taken at 8.55am ready to start the learning programme at 9.00am. While we may try several alternative phone numbers to contact a parent, if calls are not answered, where possible we will leave a voice message. If your phone numbers change at all whether it is a work, or mobile number, can you also please advise the office.

The pizza was tasty and cheesy. We did not want the fun to end! By J 5 students.



Year 5 Maths Week Activities


