Year 3 Visit from Sarah C's Bees!





As part of our topic inquiry, we had a very exciting visit from an expert Beekeeper and Educator, Sarah C. Sarah set up a live beehive filled with hundreds of buzzing, busy bees! We used our expert bee skills to spot the Queen bee, the drones and tiny eggs laid in the hexagon cells! It was so much fun dressing up as a beekeeper, using a smoker and having a go at assembling a hive!





Environmental Science

St Thomas's students are actively contributing towards the health of our environment. Last week the Year 5 Nature Ninjas participated in a Water Monitoring Programme at Kepa Stream in conjunction with the Auckland City Council and Eastern Songbird. We undertook six different water monitoring tests, including using the clarity tube and looking for biodiversity within the stream, and were pleased to find that the stream, although sluggish, was relatively healthy. We hope to adopt this section of the stream and carry out regular water testing and planting to improve it's health. The data that we capture from our monitoring is logged with Auckland Council and helps to inform the Council of any pollutants that may be being placed into stormwater drains in the area.

The Year 7 mixed netball team were excited to receive an invite to the Auckland Netball prizegiving. They received 2nd place in their grade after being promoted mid season to a higher grade. Their certificates were presented by Kate Burley, a member of the 2022-23 Silver Ferns Development Squad. Well done team!
