

Principal's Message

The unveiling of the new name plate on our entrance wall this morning was a wonderful opportunity for our waiata group to showcase their talent. Congratulations to all who took part in the performance and a special thank you to staff member Alex Titchener who teaches the group. Thank you also to our house captains who had the honour of unveiling our new name plate.

This morning, we also officially opened our new astro turf and thank you to Skyla and Hunter, two of our four sports captains, who cut the ribbon. This 1300sqm all-weather sports area is a welcome addition to our learning facility and very timely with winter approaching. This was a very large expenditure for the Board but it is part of our strategic plan to keep improving our facilities to ensure we have the best possible learning environment for our community. The astro turf is fully fenced to protect the surface from damage. Gates to the astro turf will be locked after school hours as previously we have had after school damage from e-scooters, fireworks, dog poo, chewing gum etc. As we become accustomed to using this facility during the school day we will investigate how we can hire it to after school teams and put any revenue received towards our proposed basketball courts.

The school grounds are closed after school and during the upcoming two week term break. This is because we have contractors moving around the school site with trucks and heavy equipment. These contractors are building a deck and canopy area outside Room 15 and 16 and installing seating and garden beds outside the middle block. It is expected that these projects will be completed during the term break.

- Learning about the Iron Age and designing a Roman shield to be part of a legionary
- Discovering the main aspects of the Ice Age and creating icy art
