

### **544 School Bus Update**

Our Bus Operations team is aware of school buses that need extra space. However, it is unlikely that any changes will be made in 2024 because there aren't enough buses or drivers.

The team is committed to providing safe bus services for students. They are constantly monitoring passenger numbers on school buses to make sure that they aren't overcrowded. Bus drivers are responsible for making sure that the number of students onboard is within the Student Certificate of Loading (COL) limit. This is the maximum number of passengers which can travel on a bus. There are different maximum passenger numbers on buses for adults, secondary school students, intermediate school students and primary school students.

I understand that this will be disappointing, but I hope this explains why Auckland Transport can't offer any extra services at this time.

### **National Young Leaders Day Trip**

On Thursday 23 May, the Year 8 student leaders went to Due Drop Events Centre, for the National Young Leaders Day (NYLD).

At the NYLD trip we learnt a lot of things. When we arrived the place was huge, there were around 40+ schools there and so many people! 
