Curriculum Refresh and Reporting Changes

As you may be aware, New Zealand's national curriculum has undergone a significant refresh this year. These changes aim to strengthen teaching and learning across the country. As part of this refresh, the Ministry of Education has introduced new learning progressions for how learning is delivered in schools.

What does this mean for you and your child?

The refreshed curriculum has essentially shifted the expectations for student achievement—what was previously considered "at expectation" has now moved forward by approximately one year. As a result, it is anticipated some unsettled achievement data across New Zealand primary schools over the next couple of years.

Will my child's reporting be different?

- Reporting this year and beyond will be based on the new curriculum progressions, which means that previous goals and achievement levels are no longer used for measuring progress.
- While you won't be able to see the older progression goals on current reports, historic reports will still
 include past teacher comments and overall achievement graphs. These graphs will continue to show
 how your child has progressed throughout their time at our school and will be visible on your child's
 report after our mid-year Overall Teacher Judgements (OTJ's) assessments have been made.
- Please be assured that our teachers are working diligently to align their teaching with the refreshed curriculum and support students through this transition.

Looking ahead

The government are currently seeking new assessment tools which they expect to have by the end of 2025 and are these are expected to be in use New Zealand wide in 2026.

They have yet to provide guidance on when they expect achievement data to stabilise under the new system. As soon as we receive this information, we will share it with our school community.

Thank you for your continued support as we navigate this period of change together. If you have any questions or would like to discuss your child's progress in more detail, please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher or a member of the leadership team.

I really enjoyed playing touch rugby - they gave really good and clear instructions - Arshia S12












Year 5 Learning Projects

Teacher Profile - Sara Haddon



Hi I am Sara Haddon, and as the new Visual Arts Teacher I wanted to give you a peek into a few of our art sessions. They usually start with a quick 5 minute pencil exercise focusing on the elements of art and gaining confidence using different pencil and drawing techniques. Then I introduce the skill, focus and process of the art lesson.

We work with examples, artists who influence this style, video examples, demonstrations and large board step by step processes. I try and set up experiences that allow for individuality, different abilities, new art experiences and success for everyone. Our Art room is now full of student art which we are very proud of. Eventually their art pieces will be returned to them via their class teacher.

We have got creative with water colour, zentangle patterns, painting acrylic realistic trees, using wool stitching with photos, paper collage, Mondrian primary colour panels, Tim Burton portraits, Van Gogh inspired sunflower collages and glue and chalk drawings, Japanese weaving, Banksy influenced stencilling posters, tinfoil and wire action sculpture - to name a few. The art sessions are 1 ½ hours and each class has approximately 6 sessions. I will try and share when I can. Here are a few insights to what we have been up to:
