

Principal's Message

Tēnā Koutou Katoa

Welcome back to term two and a wet start to the term. Changes in New Zealand's education system are happening at pace; some are haphazard and often schools hear about the changes in the media before we actually hear about them from the Ministry of Education. It can be a scramble for schools and parent communities to keep up to date with the pace of change and it will take time for the changes to be implemented and more importantly for evidence to emerge that they are lifting academic achievement. Here at St Thomas's School, we take a measured and strategic approach to ensure we are implementing these changes while not overwhelming staff and students with too much at once. This week the Minister of Education announced a parent portal to assist parents better understand some of the changes that are taking place, and you will find information about this on the next page.

The Ministry also released the following statement:

As part of our focus on lifting achievement we have introduced a new curriculum this year for Maths in Years 0-8 and English in Years 0-6. This means we are currently changing from the old to the new curriculum. We want to acknowledge that schools will only have been using the new curricula from the start of 2025, which includes new teaching and assessment methods and content. Because of this you could see a change in your child's progress or achievement compared to previous years which may be the result of changes in the curriculum expectation for your child's year level. Understand your child's learning


Information and resources for parents, caregivers and whānau


A new webspace on <u>education.govt.nz</u> houses practical videos, activities and resources for supporting learning








There are practice activities for each year level that you can do with your child, and 'tips and tricks' to support learning at home. Phonics cards come with parent guidance with audio files to model the correct sounds.





There is also a guide on how to prepare for the first day of school, and tips for parent-teacher interviews.





The webspace also houses important information about how children will be assessed in the early years of schooling through the new Phonics Checks and Hihira Weteoro. It describes how parents and whānau can access additional support that their child or tamaiti might need.



As the national curriculum continues to be updated and implemented in all schools and kura over the next few years, more resources and supports will become available for parents, caregivers and whānau. We encourage you

"Changing Learning for a Changing World"

House of Science

Over the first two weeks of this term, we have had House of Science in the school providing another learning experience for all our students across Years 2 – 8 on the topic of Space. The feedback that House of Science provided regarding our students' knowledge was very complementary and we are delighted to share some of it with you. Well done St Thomas's!

It's been a pleasure delivering 18 Space VR sessions to the lovely ākonga at St Thomas's School. We have been impressed with the knowledge the students had about space. Here's some of the facts they shared:

- galaxies can be spiral, elliptical, or irregular shaped
- the imaginary line between Earth's atmosphere and outer space is called the Karman line (100km from Earth's surface)
- the supermassive black hole in the centre of the Milky Way is called Sagittarius A*
- Jupiter has 95 moons and Saturn has 146.



The students really appreciated the 'out of this world' learning experience and I hope it's provided inspiration for further learning.

School Uniform – Important Reminder

Now that the weather is getting cooler students are wearing their sweatshirts/fleeces. As the day warms up these sweatshirts/fleeces are being taken off and left all over the school. Can you please speak to your child about being responsible for their clothing and putting it in their bag or cubby hole when they take it off. We try to reunite lost items as quickly as possible, but this can only happen if their name is in it. We have had a large number of items with no name, or if it is second hand it has the previous owner's name. It is very important that your child's name is very clearly marked so that it can be returned to them asap.

Reporting Student Absences

We would like to remind all parents/caregivers that reporting absences is important for the safety and wellbeing of students.

We aim to deal with all unexplained absences as quickly as possible each morning.

To minimise the number of unexplained absences, it is helpful if parents/caregivers take a few moments to advise the school of an absence **by 9.00am** in one the following ways:

- Through our Hero App (preferred)
- By telephone 09 5283938

It is not necessary to email the class teacher.

Absences must be reported each day unless the office has been advised in advance of the duration of an absence. You must state the reason for absence i.e. sick, doctor's appointment, holiday or bereavement.

Our gate is locked at 8.55am and we do have a lot of students arriving 5 minutes late. Please note, the school roll is taken at 8.55am ready to start the learning programme at 9.00am. While we may try several alternative phone numbers to contact a parent, if calls are not answered, where possible we will leave a voice message. If your phone numbers change, whether it is a work, home or mobile number, can you please advise the office.


