
Budget Announcement

Illness

You should keep your child at home if they have any symptoms of concern, such as:

- Infectious disease e.g. chicken pox
- Fever
- Vomiting or diarrhoea
- Sore Throat
- School sores or other skin infections
- A new rash or itches
- Head lice (nits)
- Wheezing or difficulty breathing

If your child has had vomiting or diarrhoea, they can return to school after 48 hours (2 days) have passed since the last time they vomited or had diarrhoea. Please do not send them back earlier.
