We have had an action packed 2 weeks with sports events, tree planting and the Education Review Office (ERO) visit.



On Saturday we planted almost 300 shrubs and trees down the bank near our developing forest area. Highly organised by our environmental science teacher, Alison Snell, parents and students enjoyed the beautiful weather and very muddy conditions. Our goal is to continue planting out this area and use it as an outdoor science learning environment where students can study science and use technology equipment to better understand our planet.





ERO visited St Thomas's to review all aspects of our school including curriculum delivery, policy and procedures, inclusion and health and safety to name but a few areas. The ERO team met with the Board, international and domestic students, parents, staff who are new to the school, team leaders and teacher assistants. They visited a range of classrooms to observe the teaching and learning programmes. We were the first school they had visited which had reached the Ministry 2030 goal for attendance and achievement targets. It was a very successful visit and something the Board, administration staff, teaching staff and the parent community can be proud of. Once we receive the official report we will share this with our community.
