Principal's Message

Our last newsletter for Term 3 and what an action filled end to the term. A range of activities including students volunteering in the community, sports tournaments, tree top adventures and of course our fabulous school production has provided our students with a range of opportunities to participate and excel. Thank you to our staff for ensuring these activities take place.

International Students

On Thursday I will fly to Seoul to meet with agents and families who are considering studying in New Zealand. I then travel to Tokyo to attend the Education New Zealand fair to meet agents and families with the same aim. International students provide a rich additional cultural perspective to our school and expand our own students view of the world. The Government is keen to grow the number of international students coming to NZ from its 2024 income of NZ\$3.6 billion to NZ\$7.2 billion by 2034. The income we derive from international students allows us to provide extra support and facilities to all St Thomas's School students.

Teachers Strike

The unions of primary school teachers, principals, school support staff and Ministry of Education specialist staff have called a national strike day on 23 October 2025 after the unions and Government failed to agree on key issues within the education sector. This strike means that any union member who works at St Thomas's School will not attend work on 23 October. With the number of school staff on strike on October 23, it is likely that the school will remain open and the remaining staff will be supervising students in shared classrooms, but no direct teaching will be able to take place. The school Board will monitor developments prior to the 23rd and the Board will decide if it is appropriate to keep the school open or close it for safety reasons.

Enjoy a well-deserved rest over the school holidays - you've truly earned it.







Treetop Adventures

On Tuesday 16 September, some Year 7 students went to Treetop Adventures to complete the William Pike Challenge.

The day started with William Pike students travelling for an hour to Woodhill Park in Muriwai. When we hopped off the bus everyone was excited to get climbing. Before long, we got our harness and helmet and completed the practice/training course. Then, we were released and could complete the courses 1 - 8. Courses 1, 2 and 3 are the lowest and easiest, so for that reason we started with those. First, you climb up a ladder to a platform attached to a tree. You're clipped onto a wire and need to move across obstacles to get to the next platform. At the end, you go down a zipline back to the ground. Some of the obstacles include: walking on wooden planks or going through tunnels and nets. Then courses 4, 5 and 6 are taller and harder than courses 1 - 3. The obstacles are different too: balancing on a thin wire, wobbling between separate, swaying ropes and going on a flying fox.

Last but definitely not least, are courses 7 and 8. They're way higher - level eight is ten meters above the ground! The zipline is 150 meters long, it's so fun.

It was a wonderful day, and it was made possible by Mrs Queale, who organised it and the three other parent helpers who supervised us - THANK YOU!
