Health and Safety Update.

Concerns regarding the possibility of asbestos contamination in sand and Kmart products in homes and schools has caused a lot of unease across the country in recent weeks. At St Thomas's School we immediately reacted to the warnings and located a small amount of product (Three unopened 1.3kg containers and one opened container). This was tested and no traces of any contamination found. We also found some Kmart product (not the ones which were recalled) and in a cautionary measure had them tested and they also tested negative of contamination. Though none of these products were of any concern we asked the testing company to retain and destroy them.

Measles, Mumps and Rubella vaccination rates for St Thomas's School (Auckland)

Measles cases have recently been identified across New Zealand and have already impacted two schools in our region. Measles spreads easily and can be serious for both children and adults. To support your preparedness, we have assessed what proportion of our school roll has evidence of measles immunity. As of 13 October 2025 698, (79.4%) of our school roll are recorded as fully immunised for Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) (two doses after 12 months of age). For our school, 181 (20.6%) students appear not to have a record on the Aotearoa Immunisation Register (AIR) of having been fully immunised. This could be because:

- 1. The student has had MMR vaccinations in New Zealand, but these have not been uploaded on AIR.
- 2. The student has overseas vaccination records that need to be verified and uploaded to AIR.
- 3. The student has missed one or two doses of MMR vaccine.
- 4. The student and/or whānau have declined MMR vaccination.

Why are we sharing this data?

Individuals who are not considered immune to measles may need to stay home from school each time they are exposed, to prevent further spread. Please check your child's immunisation status to ensure it is up to date. Inform the school if we need to update your information.


