MATHEX 2026

Every Term 3, Auckland's keenest mathematicians head to Barfoot & Thompson Stadium for the Auckland Maths Association's prestigious MATHEX competition, a fast-paced challenge filled with algebraic formulas, geometric patterns, and mind-boggling questions. Schools send their best teams to earn a place on the leaderboard, tackling 20 questions worth 5 points each, with no opportunity to return to skipped questions.

St Thomas's School proudly sent two teams, accompanied by Miss Pattullo and Mr Edmondson:

To prepare for the competition, the Year 8 team dedicated every spare moment to practising past MATHEX papers, even taking on Year 9 and Year 10 questions.

Competition night brought a lively atmosphere, with cheering crowds, excited teams, and the pressure of solving problems quickly and accurately. Both teams rose to the challenge, demonstrating excellent teamwork, perseverance, and mathematical thinking.

- Year 8: An outstanding 100/100 points in the 8:00 pm round, a feat no St Thomas's Year 8 team has achieved in years!

Mitey in Action Across Our School

At St Thomas's School, the Mitey programme continues to support students in developing resilience, wellbeing, positive relationships, and a strong sense of belonging. Through a range of engaging, hands-on activities, students across different year levels have explored important themes such as kindness, teamwork, empathy, inclusion, and understanding their own unique strengths. These learning experiences have encouraged meaningful conversations and provided opportunities for students to reflect on how their words and actions can positively impact those around them. Here is a snapshot of some of the Mitey learning taking place across our school this term.

Year 4 Mitey Marine Inquiry

In Year 4, we have been using Mitey to explore what makes each of us unique and how our individual strengths can contribute to a team. Through our marine inquiry, students discovered the special strengths and adaptations of different marine creatures before reflecting on their own amazing qualities. We also created a collaborative kelp forest, with each student contributing their individual strengths to show how we are stronger when we work together. Students are now using these attributes to support their teams as they collaborate on their inquiry project.



Year 5 Mitey 'Our Living World'



This term in Year 5, we have witnessed and celebrated a great deal of resilience from our students. Through experiences such as speeches and cross country, students have been developing their ability to recognise and manage a range of emotions while continuing to build a positive, supportive and encouraging classroom environment.

Our current topic, 'Our Living World', has provided opportunities for students to explore different habitats and make meaningful connections to the world around them. We have also been considering our own classroom as a 'habitat', exploring how our environment, relationships and actions contribute to a positive and thriving community.

Through drama, role-play and other hands-on learning experiences, students have been encouraged to explore these ideas creatively, develop empathy, and make connections between their learning and real-life experiences. It has been wonderful to see their confidence, resilience and sense of belonging continue to grow throughout the term.

S10 students took part in an engaging Whispering Tunnel, designed to explore how we can encourage and support someone who is feeling upset after a negative situation. In one scenario, a student accidentally kicked the ball into the wrong goal. As the student walked through the tunnel, classmates on one side whispered positive and encouraging words, while those on the other side shared negative comments. This powerful activity encouraged students to reflect on the impact their words can have on others and highlighted the importance of choosing kind, supportive words that help lift people up.



As part of our Mitey programme, we learned about positive ways to work with others. We worked in small groups to create papier-mâché sea creatures, where we practised teamwork and learned how to overcome challenges together.



S9 & S11 - The Paper Chain Activity

We were able to write down lots of information which we can use later on if we do get bullied. We were able to put our paper chains together. Being able to write kind comments to each other was fun.

First paper chain- What is Bullying?

Second paper chain- What types of bullying are there?

Third paper chain- What strategies do we have when we are being bullied or when we see bullying happening?

Fourth paper chain- Something we think about our friends and family.

Fifth paper chain- One way we can show kindness towards others.

Sixth paper chain- Second way we can show kindness towards others.

Seventh paper chain- Third way we can show kindness towards others.



The activities encouraged students to think about belonging, teamwork and the impact of our individual actions on a group. Students developed an understanding that small acts of kindness, encouragement and inclusion can make a big difference in creating a safe and supportive classroom environment.

What's been happening in our Intermediate School

HISTORY

This term, students have had History introduced to our learning programme through our Discovery Lab learning. Each teacher is focusing on one moment in history.

Students are examining our central idea that 'Events in the past impact the present'. Each student is looking at a series of pivotal moments in history to understand the context, the options that were available to those present and how those actions have influenced events to this day.

Through this, Year 7 and 8 students are learning about:

- The French Revolution
- The Salem Witch Trials
- Apartheid
- The Civil Rights Movement
- Christopher Columbus
- The Creation of the World Wide Web

Students are being modelled the inquiry process through learning about these historical events, and they will then conduct their own inquiry on a historical event that interests them. We are looking forward seeing some fantastic inquiry learning from the students!

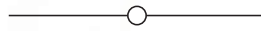
